**WATER RATE CHANGES: At the December Village Board Meeting the Board approved the 3rd reading of Ordinance 2016-2 to change base water rates. The water rates will be based on the size of the meter you have. Residential rates are as follows: ¾" base rate is \$19.00; 1" base rate will be \$21.00; 1 ½" base rate will be \$24.00; 2" base rate will be \$27.00. You can review the Ordinance in its entirety at the Post Office, CerescoBank, or the Village Office.

** WASTE CONNECTIONS: Was awarded the bid for solid waste removal for the Village, by drastically reducing their monthly prices. New residential prices starting in January are: 35 gal can (provided by customer) - \$10.00; one toter (they provide) - \$10.95; toter/can - \$12.45; two toters - \$12.95; three toters - \$14.95. Optional recycling 65 gal toter \$5.95. Remember to have your trash out to the curb by 5:00 AM. 
- ** PROPANE SAFETY TIPS: If you smell gas, put out all smoking materials and open flames. Do not operate lights, telephones or cell phones. Get everyone out of the building or area where you suspect the gas is leaking. Shut off the gas supply valve of the propane tank IF it is safe to do so. Report leak from a neighbor's home. If you cannot reach your propane retailer call 911. Do not return to the building or area until your propane retailer, emergency responder, or qualified service technician determines that it is safe. Get your system checked.
- ** COMPOST SITE: Is not a dump or a landfill and CANNOT be treated like one. Do not leave trash bags at the compost site. It is a collection site for tree branches and grass clippings only. "Clean" lumber cannot even be left at the compost site. Make sure to keep the piles separate. (Tree branches in the tree pile/grass in the grass pile.) Citations may be issued because we risk losing it. Please contact the Village Office if you see any illegal dumping. A description of the vehicle and a license plate number would be a big help. PLEASE DO NOT DRIVE IN THE COMPOST SITE WHEN IT IS MUDDY.



**DID YOU KNOW: Ceresco was established on July 1, 1869 and the first Post Office was located in a sod house located on the Ira Nelson farm. When the railroad was built in southeastern Nebraska the rails were laid a mile east of the village. Therefor it became necessary to move the town closer to the railroad. That began in 1886. When Ceresco was incorporated in 1887 it had 30 businesses. In 1895 the entire business section of town, 30 buildings, were destroyed by fire that originated in a building that had a saloon in it.







Citations may be issued because we are at risk of losing it. Please contact the Village Office if you see any illegal dumping.
